ABOUT TIE



LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

As TiE embarks on its 30th year, we must "future-proof" our organization. The global board spent a significant time on structural alignment to ensure both "relevance" and "value-addition". Our focus was to ensure TiE Global continues to be the fundamental structural fabric amplifying the single brand of "TiE", while retaining the individuality of chapters. We standardized programs, so the overarching programs remain similar, and chapters can add their inputs to suit the local ecosystem.

While many of these programs existed earlier, we worked to provide stable central leadership to engage with thought leaders and ensure make playbooks available to everybody. TiE Women, TGA, TIA, and TiE University got turbo-charged in this endeavor. New adopters learned from best practices refined by mature and seasoned chapters without reinventing the wheel.

Another critical initiative to the core of TiE, Chapter Development, was essayed. We were clear that we are not just chasing numerical supremacy by increasing the number of chapters but, on the contrary, ensuring that even if we have fewer chapters, we are making sure that they represent a stronger brand qualitatively. Hence, the chapters dilutive to the fundamental ethos were issued closure notices and we focused our limited organizational bandwidth on chapters with potential.

TiE Global Summit was hosted in December in Dubai - that played host to excellent speakers, startups, content, and CMs from different cities at the beautiful Dubai Expo 2020. Additionally, during the Covid crisis, it was heart-warming to see the TiE community coming together in adverse times, raising funds, providing access to healthcare equipment, logistics support, and being there for each other.

Lastly, I would like to mention that I started my journey with TiE as a young member in 1999. Steering this organization with fellow board members was a humbling experience. Bidding adieu to this role does not imply my association with TiE comes to a halt. As Robert Frost famously said, "And miles to go before I sleep," I will continue this journey of learning, fostering entrepreneurship, and giving back to the entrepreneurial community of TiE that has given me immense knowledge, mentors, lessons and lifelong friends.

The TiE Women Global Pitch Competition 2021 witnessed a magnificent culmination at GITEX Global 2021 under GITEX Future Stars in Dubai. With participants from 40 locations, from applicants across 30 countries, three women entrepreneurs walked away with \$100,000 in cash prizes and in-kind support.

Winner: Neha Jain, ZeroCircle from TiE Delhi-NCR

1st Runner Up: Myra Arshad, AltTex from TiE NY/Toronto

2nd Runner Up: Farah Emara, FreshSource from TiE Dubai (Egypt)

TiE Women has accelerated 240+ women-led startups in two years. Connect Series, Open Mic Nights and Active Learning Workshops were added in 2021 to amplify and encompass more entrepreneurs. under the leadership of Dharti Arvind Desai (TiE New York) and Smita Siddhanti (TiE DC) as co-chairs.

TiE Young Entrepreneurs (TYE)

Over the last 17 years (from 2005 in Boston), 21,500 high schoolers graduated from the TYE program. In the 2020-21 cohort, led by Shashi Jain (Oregon) as chair, we had participation from 1500 students. The TYE Global Final Competition 2021 was hosted by TiE Carolinas on June 18-19. Total cash prizes worth USD 12,500 were awarded to student teams.

1st Place: Asteria (TiE DC), a machine-learning-based, predictive cybersecurity services startup

2nd Place: Scollab (TiE Boston), a collaboration platform for students3rd Place: Intern-net (TiE Rajasthan), a platform for matching high school students to company internships

In 2021-22, 25 chapters are running the program. We have a new leadership team in place with Madan Padaki (Bengaluru), Kanchana Raman (Atlanta) & Tariq Khan (New York) in building this asset into a formidable entity.

TiE University

In 2021, 27 Chapters, 526 teams, 1520 University students from 7 countries participated in the global pitch competition. Cash Prizes worth \$87K and inkind Prizes over \$900K were awarded to the winning teams of the TiE University pitch competition.

1st Place: ALT TEX (University of Toronto), TiE Toronto 2nd Place: SURVIVR (University of Texas), TiE Dallas

3rd Place: Insight Optics (Georgia Institute of Technology), TiE Atlanta

The Hackathon had a participation of 22 chapters from 6 countries, 700+teams with over 2300 students for the 20 challenges. Thanks to Dr Paul Lopez (Atlanta), Ravi Puli (Washington DC), SubbaRajuPericherla (Hyderabad) and Viveck Verma (Hyderabad) for their leadership.

TiE Global Angels (TGA)

Led by CN Madhusudan (Atlanta), Shankar Ram (SoCal), Maninder Dhaliwal (Vancouver), Kumar Sripadam (Silicon Valley), and Vivek Soni (Boston), TiE Global Angels picked up momentum in 2021. \$25Mn invested to date in 30+companies. Additionally, chapters with active angels have invested before bringing them to the Global platform. Cumulatively, TGA facilitated investments worth \$76Mn in over 230+ deals. Individual sites for Chapters claim:

TiE SV - \$13Mn, 70 companies TiE Boston - \$19Mn, 85 companies

TiE Oregon - \$14Mn, 60 companies

TIE SoCal - \$5Mn, 20+ companies

TiE India Angels (TIA)

Led by Mahavir Pratap Sharma (Rajasthan), V. Shankar (Chennai), and Uday Kothari (Pune), TIA started its deal flow in July 2021. The team screened 104 applications and shortlisted 10 deals for investor pitches. So far TIA investments have been made worth INR 6.5 Cr in 4 deals, with more in the pipeline.





Chapter Development

A chapter development team led by Gita Dang (New Delhi) along with Tariq Khan (New York), Puneet Pushkarna (Singapore) and PK Gulati (Dubai), and BJ Arun (Silicon Valley) had an arduous task of examining historical data of the chapters to strengthen the organization and upholding the brand of TiE. The efforts of this team led to changes to affiliation agreements, improved communications with chapters, onboarding new president processes, chapter award criteria and selection, etc. Unfortunately, we had to make a tough call in disaffiliating and closing four chapters, including Dhaka, Guwahati, Israel, and Sydney, as they were not in good standing for several years. While we remain committed to fostering entrepreneurship worldwide, we've invited the charter members of these chapters to continue their association as part of TiE Global charter membership.

TiE Global Impact Report

Over the last 30 years, TiE has created a tremendous impact around the world where our Chapters have worked with Startups, Investors, Partners, and the Government to build the ecosystem and influence policy. TiE Global commissioned KPMG to do an independent study on the impact by researching and interviewing each chapter and creating a report that can be used to position TiE appropriately and tell a compelling story. We published an Impact Report encompassing the performance of various TiE Chapters worldwide. The process took over 6 months where the KPMG team led by TiE Global Trustee Pradeep Udhas (Mumbai), spent considerable time with each chapter to unearth unheard stories of impact in their ecosystem. Over the years, TiE has nurtured more than 25,000 startups, creating an exceptional mark in the global entrepreneurial ecosystem. The report is available here.

Government Affairs

Over the years various TiE Chapters have collaborated with Central and State Government bodies in India. To ensure sustained long-term collaboration with the Indian government, we have appointed former DPIIT Secretary, Ramesh Abhishek as an advisor. Thank you to TiE Global Trustee Ravi Narayan (Bangalore) for taking a lead on this.

Covid Fundraiser

Covid crippled the healthcare infrastructure throughout 2021. India suffered majorly during the second wave in March 2021. It was heartening to see the combined forces of TiE focus on finding ways to assist the ones in need. At the fundraising event led by Singapore chapter president Amit Gupta and his incredible team, along with Amit Mookim (Mumbai) and other chapters, spearheaded a fundraising campaign (in partnership with Give India). The campaign -'I Breathe for India' aimed to ensure that help was extended on a pan-India basis. We raised over \$3.5M to the cause with celebrities from Bollywood, sports, and spirituality taking part in it. The link to the event can be found here Gita Dang (Global Trustee, Delhi-NCR) and several others, worldwide, started a Covid Goods and Services group on WhatsApp. They provided connections and support, from access to oxygen concentrators/cylinders to medicines and hospital beds, masks, etc. More than 250 members across the globe came together to make connections and provide support to anyone who sought it.
